Recognising the increasing number of people that are being made redundant throughout the Royal Borough, we teamed up with both our local Rotary Clubs to do our bit to help those trying to re-enter the job market. On Saturday, 25th April Maidenhead Rotaract organised our first free CV and Interview Seminar attended by over 30 people from all walks of life.

People came to get much needed advice on how to create a winning CV, how to perform at interview and most importantly how to market themselves to ensure they stand out from the crowd.

The advice was provided by several experts including Pat Hartwell from the Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development – Thames Valley Branch, Judi Badenoch from Cranbrook Consulting, as well as Kate Donovan and Kellie Rainbow from Reed Recruitment. We were also supported by

both local Rotary Clubs.

Those that attended the seminar found it invaluable, one jobseeker commented “The seminar was very well organised and included a fantastic array of experienced HR professionals to learn from. It’s crucial for people to feel a sense of support during tough times and the Rotaract Club of Maidenhead are providing this support completely free of charge”.

Based on the success of this first seminar, we are looking to make this a regular series of community seminars offering in-depth workshops with mock interviews, practical CV writing sessions and more. Stay tuned!

Several members enjoyed another comedy night at Jongleurs in Reading. The first 2 acts were kind of amusing but the last act was fantastic...very funny in deed!

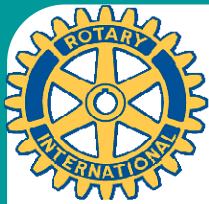
We had the unfortunate luck of sitting right in front of the stage (again), which was clearly felt by Leo and Christophe who was picked on all evening!

SPEAKER: ROP

We were fortunate enough to be joined at one of our club meetings by Jon Hoare, past District Chairman and participant in the 2009 Rotaract Overseas Project (ROP) to The Gambia, West Africa.

The Rotaract Overseas Projects were started in 1995 with the aim to help locals construct whatever amenities are greatly needed in the area. All projects employ local people and use local resources to help the local economy and ensure no work / skills are taken from the area. All projects are based around education, health and culture and cost approx. £900 per person, plus £12,000–£19,000 for the actual project, which is raised by the participants and their clubs.

In January Jon and 8 other Rotaractors and 4 Rotarians left the UK for 12 days in The Gambia. Upon their arrival they met the local Rotary Club with whom they exchanged experiences and ideas. After their first night in a hotel they travelled up-country to start their work. All teams live as locals do and on this occasion the team were put up by the local horse and donkey sanctuary, a nearby charity which teaches locals how to treat the animals.

At the end of their time in The Gambia the team had successfully helped 2 villages by building a wall around a clinic to keep the animals out and maintain the cleanliness needed, building a simple toilet block for patients, building a wash house and digging a bore hole, building a water tower and laying pipes to take fresh drinking water to several locations within the village.
